

## Chapter-Level Online Access to Elsevier's *Handbooks in Economics*

**Note:** for access off-campus, your Web browser must be configured with the [BOL Proxy Server](#)

Most electronic books, journals, and databases are restricted to use by UCLA's currently enrolled students, faculty, and staff. When a currently eligible user is off-campus, he or she must be **authenticated** (verified as currently affiliated with UCLA) by the **proxy server in order to use these services**.

Here are brief instructions for one of the most widely used configurations, Internet Explorer 5.5 or higher on a PC using Windows:


1. Open Internet Explorer. From the **Tools** pull-down menu, select **Internet Options**.
2. Click on the **Connections** tab.
3. Click the **LAN Settings...** button.
4. Check the box next to **Use automatic configuration script**.
5. Type the following in the address field: <http://proxy.ucla.edu/cgi/proxy>
6. When you access a UCLA restricted site, a secure page will ask you to enter your UCLA Logon ID and password (familiar to you as your Bruin logon ID and password) before proceeding to the site.

You **must** have a UCLA Logon ID and password in order to use the BOL Proxy Server. With the exception of alumni and extension students, everyone at UCLA is eligible for a UCLA Logon ID and password. For complete information, see <https://logon.ucla.edu/>


- Access Method #1: **DIRECT URL FOR *HANDBOOKS IN ECONOMICS***  
(initially "bypass" ScienceDirect)
  - (1) Go to <http://www.elsevier.com/hes/>
  - (2) On the resulting page, all the *Handbooks* are listed alphabetically by title. Clicking on a "volume" link (i.e., Volume 1, Volume 2, etc.) will bring up a description/summary of the volume only.
  - (3) Instead, click on the Full-text via Science Direct link, which appears immediately under the name(s) of the specific *Handbook* editor(s), to access a screen which provides the complete, chapter-by-chapter contents of the volume.
  - (4) Appearing with each chapter entry are the following links (*not* live in this example):

  - (5) Click on the PDF link to open an individual chapter. Right-click on the PDF link (a) to open the chapter in a new browser window, or (b) to save the chapter to your desktop, or an output device.

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- Access Method #2: VIA SCIENCE DIRECT

Browse	Search [Quick Search]
<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>(1) Go to <a href="http://www.sciencedirect.com/">http://www.sciencedirect.com/</a></li><li>(2) Click on Browse</li><li>(3) Click on the letter <b>H</b></li><li>(4) The first screen that results lists all the <i>Handbook</i> titles alphabetically; click on a desired title, then follow steps #4 and #5 above.</li></ol>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>(1) Go to <a href="http://www.sciencedirect.com">http://www.sciencedirect.com</a></li><li>(2) [a] At <b>Journal/book title</b> (within the gray bar, near the top of the screen), type in keywords for the title desired (i.e., <i>handbook econometrics</i>) OR [b] At <b>Author</b> type in a desired name &amp; at <b>Journal/book title</b> type in simply <i>handbook</i></li><li>(3) Click on <b>Go</b> </li><li>(4) Result is (or should be!) a title match. Click on the title, then follow steps #4 and #5 above</li></ol>

- Access Method #3: VIA UCLA LIBRARY CATALOG

- (1) Go to <http://catalog.library.ucla.edu>
- (2) At Search (in Keyword), type in "handbooks in economics" and online--*and be sure to include the punctuation as it is shown here*
- (3) Click on Search
- (4) Each of the catalog records retrieved with this search includes a link to the page in *ScienceDirect* devoted to the particular title called up (including, of course, direct links to each individual chapter contained within the volume). The link in the catalog record looks like this:

- (5) Follow steps #4 and #5 (from Access Method #1, above)
